David Moore, HFCC Executive Agent

David Moore is Chief of the Transportation Human Factors Division at the US DOT Volpe Center. In that role he works with scientists, policymakers, planners, and engineers conducting transportation-related safety research and program evaluation with the goal of improving transportation safety. They apply the existing knowledge of human capability, judgment, and decision making to complex transportation systems across surface and aviation modes to create deeper understanding, to inform design, and to help formulate policy. He currently serves as Executive Agent for the US DOT Human Factors Coordinating Committee (HFCC).

Prior to serving as the Chief of the Transportation Human Factors Division, David Moore served for more than five years as a management and program analyst in the Volpe Center's Safety Measurement and Analysis Division. In that role he managed the Volpe Center's support of a federal regulatory agency's redesign of their enforcement and compliance assistance programs. Responsibilities included (1) overseeing the elements of the program, (2) working with the customer to understand their requirements and (3) ensuring that products and services were timely, of high quality, and met the expectations of the customer and the standards of the Volpe Center.

Before joining the U.S. DOT in 2009, David Moore served for approximately 13 years in various roles supporting federal government clients as a consultant for the companies Booz Allen Hamilton and CASE, LLC. He earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Political Science from Colorado College, a Master of Arts Degree in Urban and Environmental Policy and Planning from Tufts University, and a Graduate Certificate in Geographic Information Systems from Pennsylvania State University.
